The Holiday Season is a time of great joy and celebration, Christmas lights and Decorations, where we gather with friends and family to be thankful, to take account of the previous year, and to Worship and Praise the Birthday of our Lord Jesus Christ. As an endlessly curious Christian with no level of minutiae too great to pursue, for years I researched The birth of Christ. I learned some interesting (to me at least) facts like Christmas wasn't in December because it was too cold for the shepherds and their flocks to be out the field. And you couldn't have Christmas in September because of College Football Games. I also learned that the 3 wise men were not 3 Benevolent guys riding Camels bringing gifts to the manger. Why would Herrod be afraid of that? Because they weren't 3 Benevolent guys. They were Warrior Priests and more importantly Kingmakers. With a huge party of men and equipment with them to make it so. And they showed up at Joseph and Mary's house when
